Christ the King is a relatively recent addition to the church's calendar, first instituted among Roman Catholic Christians in 1929, by Pope Pius XI. Recognizing a good thing when they saw it, many Protestants quickly adopted the observation as well. Pius established Christ the King Sunday

in response to deep concerns he had about Western society at the time, the rise of extreme nationalism and the rise of secularism. Sadly he was accurate about both. Within a decade the world would be plunged into the horrors of the Second World War, the result, in large degree to the extreme nationalism promoted in Germany, Italy and Japan. Such extreme nationalism claimed that the first priority of life was nation – rather than God. Secularism – the approach to life which may acknowledge God's existence, but little more than that, is now the dominant worldview in most of western society. Christ the King is a proclamation, by contrast, that the God whom we know best in Jesus

Christ is the supreme concern of life and its first priority.
