Hi, everyone; As we prepare for our annual meeting to recap 2024 and introduce our proposed budget for 2025, we wanted to share a few points relating to the past year. To begin with, in January 2024, we received a special donation to cover our deficit from the previous year, which was just over \$4.000.00. That donation was made so that we could begin 2024 without having to deal with a shortfall carried over from 2023, and was very much appreciated. As we progressed throughout 2024, we were fortunate enough to receive periodic donations which resulted in an increase of \$17,270.00 in offerings for 2024 when compared to 2023. Our annual "giving tree" event also saw an increase in 2024 with total pledges of \$15,980.00 As we present the budget for 2025, we felt it was important to identify these special gifts and acknowledge the fact that our success in ending the year with a surplus of \$9,732.98 was due to the special consideration of several people. As we prepare for 2025, we need to be mindful that it may not be possible to have this level of financial support repeated, and as such, you will see that reflected in the projections for 2025. We felt it was important to make these distinctions as discussions take place surrounding 2025. We also wanted to offer our sincere thanks to the congregation for your continued support of SPC.

Scripture Reading: Luke 9:28-36 (NIV)

About eight days after Jesus said this, he took Peter, John and James with him and went up onto a mountain to pray.²⁹ As he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became as bright as a flash of lightning.³⁰ Two men, Moses and Elijah, appeared in glorious splendor, talking with Jesus.³¹ They spoke about his departure, which he was about to bring to fulfillment at Jerusalem.³² Peter and his companions were very sleepy, but when they became fully awake, they saw his glory and the two men standing with him.³³ As the men were leaving Jesus, Peter said to him, "Master, it is good for us to be here. Let us put up three shelters—one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah." (He did not know what he was saying.)

³⁴ While he was speaking, a cloud appeared and covered them, and they were afraid as they entered the cloud. ³⁵ A voice came from the cloud, saying, "This is my Son, whom I have chosen; listen to him." ³⁶ When the voice had spoken, they found that Jesus was alone. The disciples kept this to themselves and did not tell anyone at that time what they had seen.

Scripture Reading: Luke 9:28-36 (NIV)

³⁷ The next day, when they came down from the mountain, a large crowd met him. ³⁸ A man in the crowd called out, "Teacher, I beg you to look at my son, for he is my only child. ³⁹ A spirit seizes him and he suddenly screams; it throws him into convulsions so that he foams at the mouth. It scarcely ever leaves him and is destroying him. ⁴⁰ I begged your disciples to drive it out, but they could not."

⁴¹ "You unbelieving and perverse generation," Jesus replied, "how long shall I stay with you and put up with you? Bring your son here."

⁴² Even while the boy was coming, the demon threw him to the ground in a convulsion. But Jesus rebuked the impure spirit, healed the boy and gave him back to his father. ⁴³ And they were all amazed at the greatness of God.
